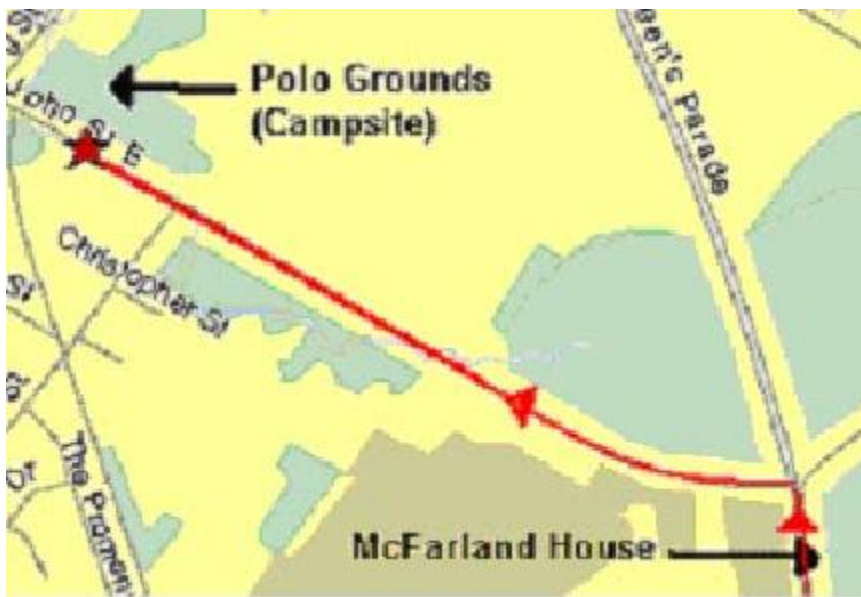
Follow I-190 North, across Grand Island, across the North Grand Island bridge and on to Lewiston (about 14 miles).

As you near Lewiston on I-190, you will see signs for the Bridge to Canada. This is your crossing point. You should have permission slips and identification ready in case they are requested by Canadian Customs. Identification for scouts should be a copy of a birth certificate or a copy of a passport. It is suggested that your scouts also wear their class A's during the crossing, to identify them as scouts.

As you cross the bridge, keep to the right-hand booths. The exit for the Niagara Parkway is literally less than 100 feet past the booths. Turn right here and follow the exit to the stop sign at the bottom of the ramp.

Turn left at the stop sign and follow the parkway for about seven miles. Watch for signs for the McFarland House, a local historical site, and proceed to the Polo Grounds

Finding the Campsite



The campsite for the Scout Brigade is on the Polo Grounds in Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, Canada. Take your second left past the McFarland House (John St.) and follow it for about 2000 ft. There will be a driveway on your right with a sign for the Scout Brigade and which will usually be manned by a member of the staff.
